HYBRIDIZING ORCHIDS

Neill Sams was our guest speaker in October. He demonstrated how to get started with hybridizing orchids. The intent of hybridizing is to improve on the existing plants. Maybe you want a stronger plant, different or enhanced color, different shape, etc. After the flower has been pollinated it typically takes about a week for a seed pod to show up. It will take another seven months for the seed pod to ripen. There are about 10,000 seeds in a pod. To continue the process to get the seeds to germinate takes a very specific process with a sterile environment. No, all 10K seeds do not become plants! The success rate of the pollination and germination relies on several factors. It certainly opened our eyes to why so many of us enjoy buying the plants from the experts!
