Learning Center with Al Sugano: Keiki Care

We are all very happy when we receive a keiki orchid as a door prize at the GIOS meetings, thanks so much to Nancy for getting us such nice ones! However, these keiki will need to grow for several years before blooming, and that is the challenge, keeping them happy and healthy. I will admit to having some of my keiki orchids die before they reached blooming size.




In this Learning Center, Al gave us some instructions to follow in order to provide better keiki care, and a better chance for these small plants to develop into fully blooming orchids. Here is his advice:



When you receive your keiki, plan to repot it into a slight larger pot right away. Don't leave the keiki as is for very long because the roots may begin to rot quickly.

Remove the keiki from its pot and remove the existing medium from the roots.





Insert the wrapped roots into the new pot, use enough sphagnum moss to ensure a snug fit.

A 2" wide slotted pot works very well and allows the water to drain while the moss holds moisture for the roots. You can set the 2" slotted pot into a larger pot or dish to capture the draining water if needed.

Place the re-potted keiki in a good spot for the light and humidity it needs in order to thrive.



Leave the keiki in this pot until it blooms, watering and fertilizing appropriately for the type of orchid you have.



Congratulations! Your keiki has finally bloomed. Pat yourself on the back for taking good care of it.

After your keiki blooms for the first time, and the blossoms are spent, remove the spike and repot it into a 4" pot with orchid bark.

Continue to enjoy your happy and healthy orchid!

Re-Potting Session

Re-potting is essential to the overall health of orchids. It provides the appropriate room and media needed for healthy growth and future blooming. Here are some indicators to help determine when it's time for re-potting:

- Re-pot after an orchid has blooms, and the blooms have faded, not when the orchid is spiking or in bloom
- Newly purchased plants are candidates for re-potting, especially if it is not in an ideal mix/media for that specific orchid or if the pot is too small
- New roots are emerging from the plant
- There are signs of "soft" deteriorating potting mix/media
- The plant is too big for the pot; it needs to be either divided or put in a larger sized pot

Here are some photos from last meeting's re-potting session. Fun was had by all, and the orchids were much happier in their new medium.
